

The Great Fifty Days of Easter began with the First Sunday of Easter, the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord on March 31. The *Book of Common Worship* (2018) describes the Season of Easter: As with Christmas, Easter refers not only to a single day, but to a whole season of celebration in the Christian year. The season of Easter spans the fifty days between the Resurrection of the Lord and the Day of Pentecost, and encompasses the Ascension of the Lord In this most joyful season, we celebrate the great mystery of our faith – that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead.
