One Day of Hope Coffee County is an ecumenical effort that relies solely on volunteers and the financial support of churches, community organizations and individuals. The annual event is entering its 14th year, and this year's event will occur on October 26. Our neighbors in need that attend the event are able to obtain clothes, shoes, groceries and hygiene products; they receive lunch; they are able to receive medical and dental attention; they can get haircuts and family portraits; they can obtain children's books; and they can visit representatives from various groups and organizations to discuss job support and community services.

Ways to Support One Day of Hope

- The primary support mechanism is through donation of new or gently used items. The Mission Committee will be collecting donations through October 19 in the narthex. Hygiene items, children's clothing and shoes, winter coats, work shoes and boots, and men's work clothing are the items requested.
- The second way to provide support is through volunteering. Volunteers are needed at the fairgrounds on October 26, the day of the event. If interested, there is a volunteer open meeting at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 19, at Manchester First Presbyterian Church.
